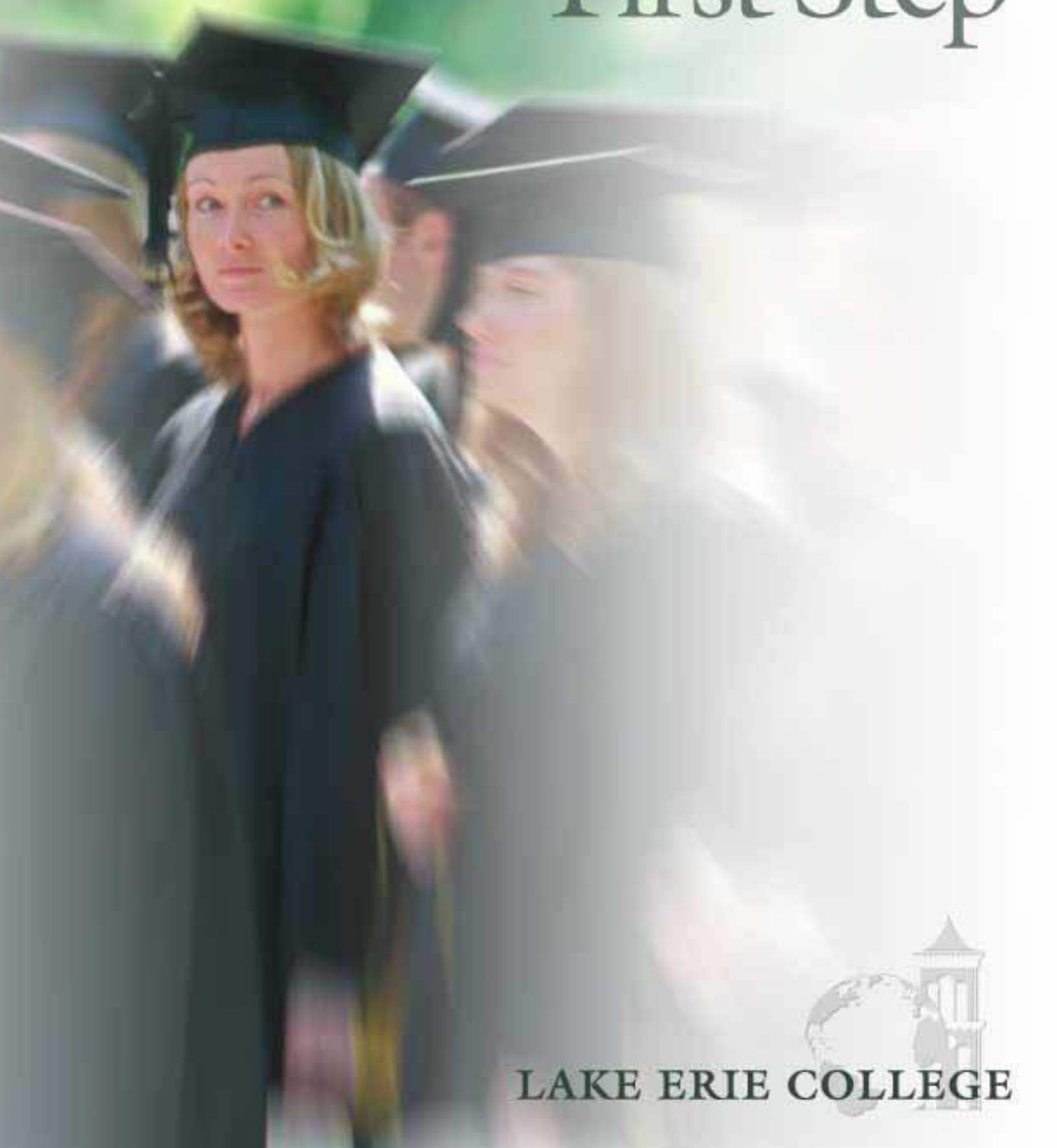

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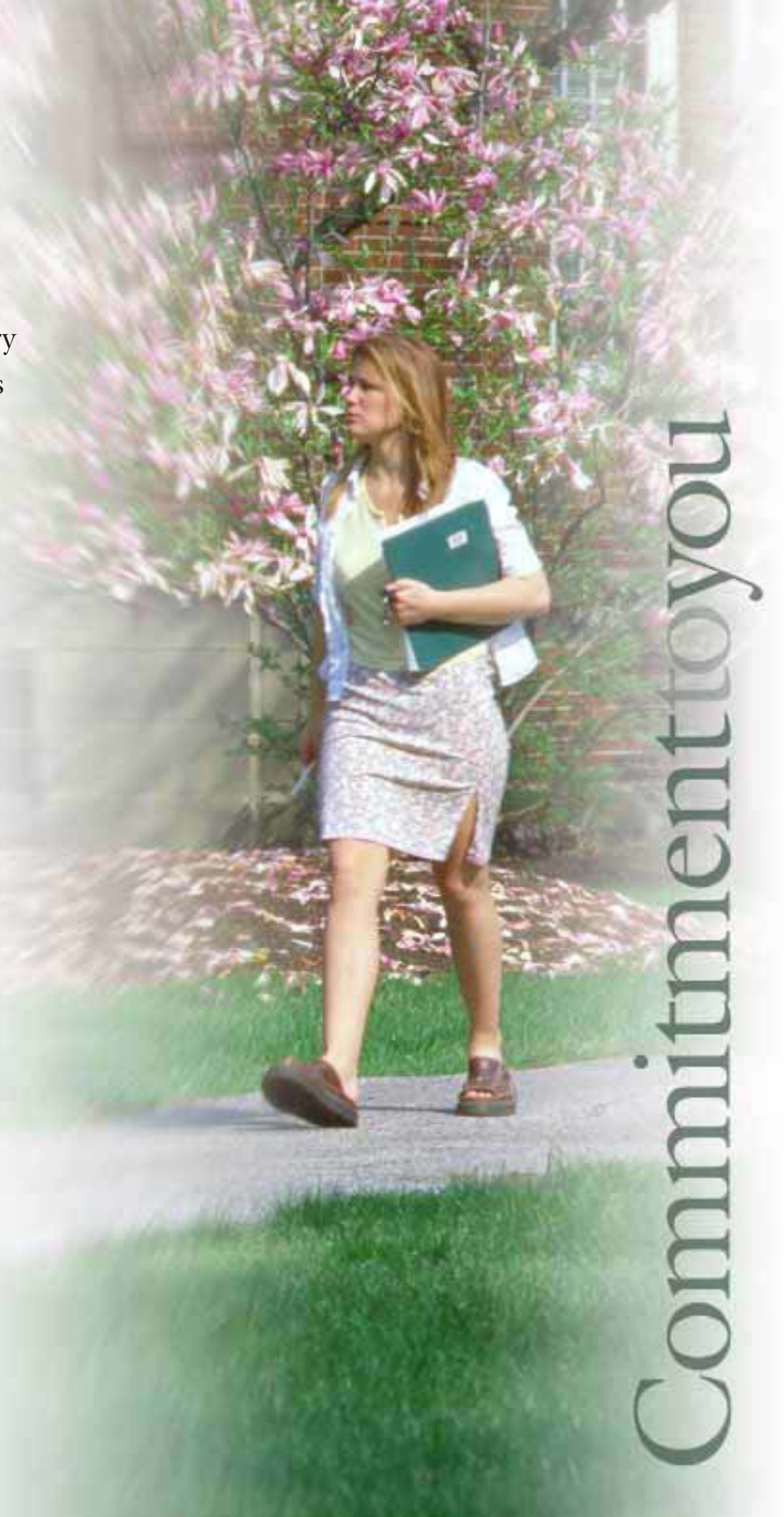


Fostering in you the capacity to derive satisfaction from every facet of living is also part of our mission.

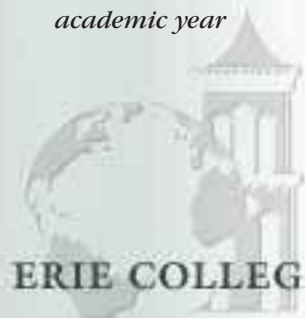

George M. Humphrey Equestrian Center

Lake Erie College's equine facilities serve our students as both a center for learning and a venue for recreation and athletic competition. The Equestrian Center is situated on a beautiful 160-acre farm six miles from our main campus. Although many of our students bring their cars to campus, we provide

Stabling for college owned horses is located in the Clarence T. Reinberger Equestrian Work Center. This facility houses the stud farm laboratory, the breeding area, foaling stalls, an 80' x 96' arena, barn office, and two tack rooms.

The George M. Humphrey Center features:

- Two indoor arenas – a 100' x 225' horse show arena with bleacher and box seating for 1000 people, and a 75' x 130' horse show warm up arena
- Heated observation areas
- Classroom areas
- Concession stand for horse shows and events

Outdoor facilities include:

- Paddocks
- Wooded trails
- Multi-purpose grass hunt field with two sand rings, one limestone ring, and cross country obstacles including a multiple level bank
- Round pen

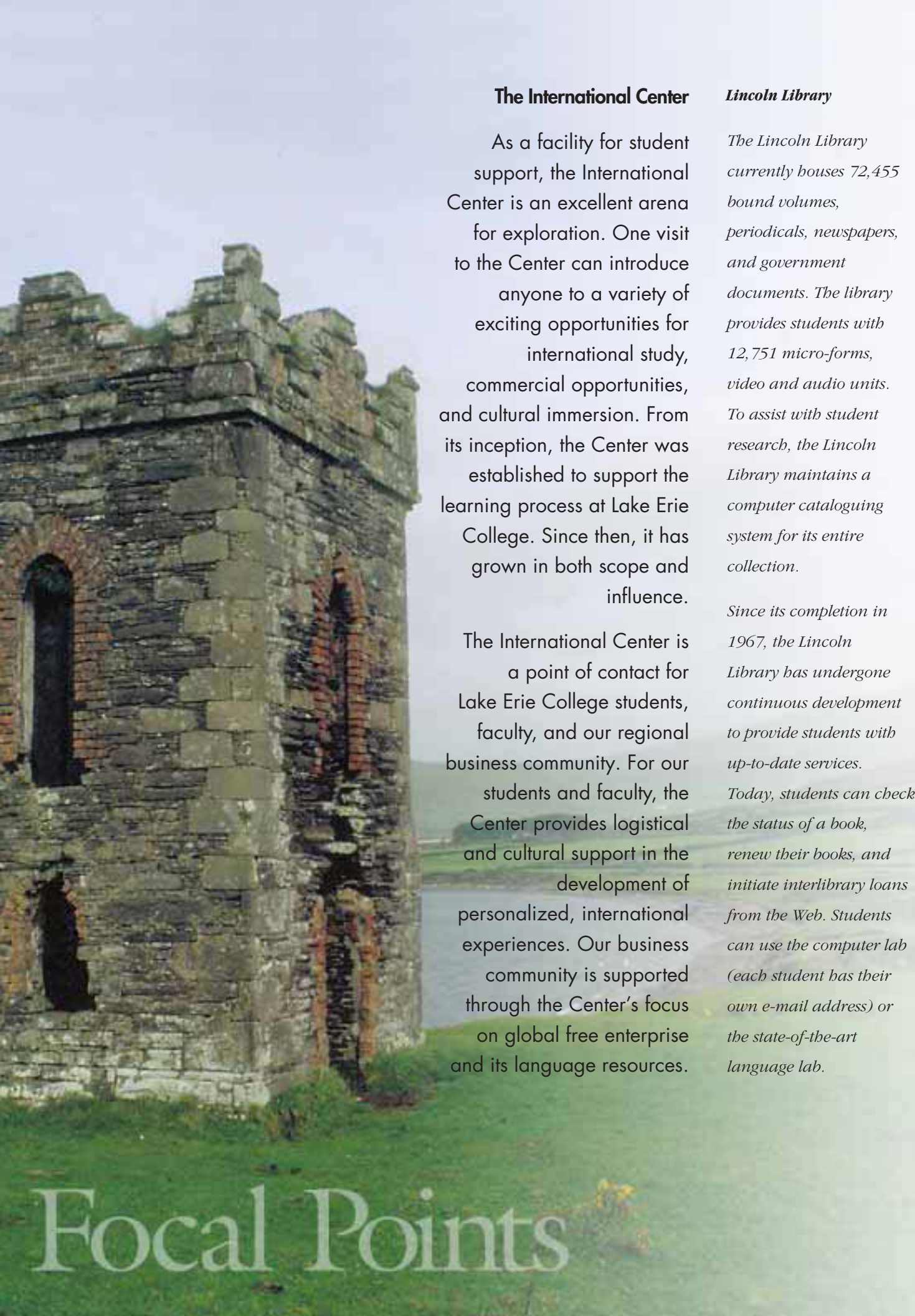

The International Center

As a facility for student support, the International Center is an excellent arena for exploration. One visit to the Center can introduce anyone to a variety of exciting opportunities for international study, commercial opportunities, and cultural immersion. From its inception, the Center was established to support the learning process at Lake Erie College. Since then, it has grown in both scope and influence.

The International Center is a point of contact for Lake Erie College students, faculty, and our regional business community. For our students and faculty, the Center provides logistical and cultural support in the development of personalized, international experiences. Our business community is supported through the Center's focus on global free enterprise and its language resources.

Lincoln Library

The Lincoln Library currently houses 72,455 bound volumes, periodicals, newspapers, and government documents. The library provides students with 12,751 micro-forms, video and audio units. To assist with student research, the Lincoln Library maintains a computer cataloguing system for its entire collection.

Since its completion in 1967, the Lincoln Library has undergone continuous development to provide students with up-to-date services. Today, students can check the status of a book, renew their books, and initiate interlibrary loans from the Web. Students can use the computer lab (each student has their own e-mail address) or the state-of-the-art language lab.

Lake County

Lake County is a thriving mix of agriculture, education, recreation, business, and industry. Rigorous economic development is apparent in the growth of large and small businesses, new homes, and the number of families calling Lake County home. Although the County's population is 225,000 (and growing) and is home to Ohio's largest high school, our community retains many small town advantages that has attracted people to the region for more than two centuries.

Since 1856, Lake Erie College has been a focal point for Lake County and the historic town of Painesville. Visitors to the area are usually surprised by our East Coast style of architecture; this and other cultural aspects of our community are due to our regional heritage as part of the Western Reserve, a holding of Connecticut. New Englanders were the primary founders when the area's population grew in the 1800's.

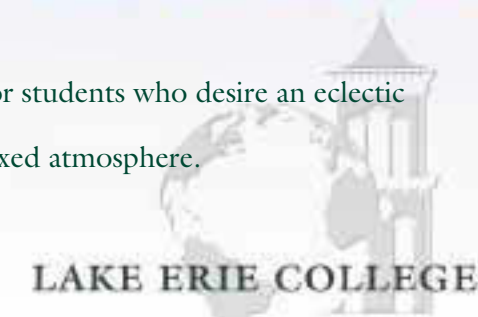

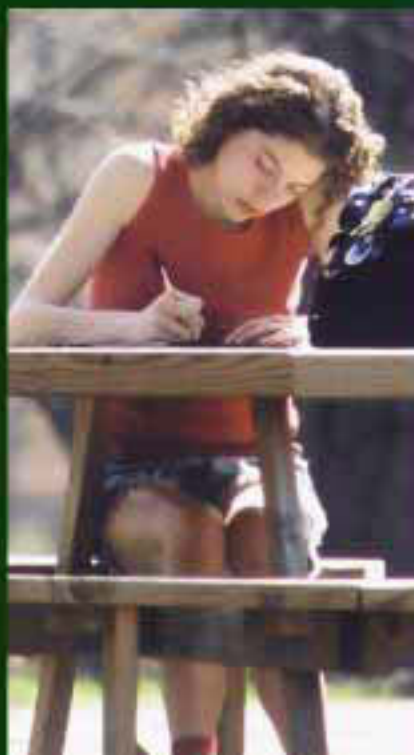

As evidence of Lake Erie College's responsiveness to the desires of our students, we have reinstated the Lake Erie College Twins Scholarship. Types of Assistance

Since our departmental mission is broad and the needs of our students are diverse, we offer a large variety of financial aid programs. The majority of our comprehensive financial aid packages are comprised of the following: Lake Erie College Scholarship and Grants, Lake Erie College Endowed Scholarships, Lake Erie College Need-Based Grants, Federal and State Grant Programs (based on eligibility), and programs of Self Help.

The "Self Help" programs are based on eligibility and include Federal Work Study, General Student Employment, and various student loan programs.

Who Should Apply

Everyone should apply for financial aid. Every family's situation is unique; therefore, you cannot compare your likelihood to receive assistance to that of your friends or neighbors. To apply for financial aid, Lake Erie College only requires a student to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid.

The FAFSA is available in January and should be completed when you complete your tax returns. When completing the FAFSA, please remember that Lake Erie College's code is **003066**.

Applying for Admission

To be considered for admission to Lake Erie College, you need only to:

1. Complete the attached application (please enclose the \$25.00 application fee)
2. Submit your transcripts (after you begin your senior year)
3. Submit your ACT or SAT scores

Once we receive your admission materials, a decision regarding your admission will be made within two days. You will receive official notification of our decision within one week. Please note that candidates for admission are encouraged to complete a college preparatory program of study in high school; this program includes English, math, social studies, natural science, and foreign language courses.

Transfer Admission

Through our various transfer agreements and merit scholarship programs, Lake Erie College works to attract transferring students. If you are interested in transferring to Lake Erie College, your application process will include all the steps listed for freshmen admission; in addition to these steps, we will need transcripts from all the institutions that you attended. If you have earned an Associate Degree from an accredited institution, we will not require your high school transcripts.





Lake Erie at a Glance

Driving Directions

From the West - Route 90

Drive east on Route 90 to the Route 44 Exit (#200). Turn north onto Route 44. The next exit is Route 84. Take this exit. At the exit, turn right, then take the immediate left onto Chestnut St. Chestnut ends at Route 20. Turn right (heading east). Lake Erie College is 0.5 mile on the right.

From the West - Route 2

Drive east on Route 2 to the Route 44 Exit South. Follow Route 44 South to the first exit (Jackson Street). At the exit, continue straight 3 blocks until you reach Route 20. At the light, turn left onto Route 20. Lake Erie College is 1 mile on the right.

From the East

Drive west on Route 90 to the Route 44 Exit (#200). Turn north onto Route 44. The next exit is Route 84. Take this exit. At the exit, turn right, then take the immediate left onto Chestnut Street. Chestnut Street ends at Route 20. Turn right (heading east). Lake Erie College is 0.5 mile on the right.

Drive north on Route 44. Take the Route 84 exit. This exit is the first exit after the Route 90 overpass. At the exit, turn right, then take the immediate left onto Chestnut Street. Chestnut Street ends at Route 20. Turn right (heading east). Lake Erie College is 0.5 mile on the right.
