


Partly because of the diversity of the campus community, and partly because of the attention values and ethics receive here, you will develop a healthy sense of what it means to share the world with others.

The college maintains an ecumenical, nondenominational focus. Students of all faiths will feel comfortable here.




Working with local children in our popular Community Riding Program is just one of the ways St. Andrews students give of themselves through service

The Therapeutic Riding Program is a degree option for students in St. Andrews' distinguished Equestrian Program, which also includes a specialized program of study in Equine Business Management. The Equestrian Program offers instruction in riding and training horses, operates the Community Riding Program, and enables the College's riding teams to compete in prestigious events. (St. Andrews' varsity riding team won the Affiliated National Riding Commission national championship in 1996 and 1997.)



### Admission to St. Andrews

Each student is assigned an admissions counselor who will act as a guide throughout the enrollment process, serving as a resource and point of contact for you. To be considered for admission, you must complete at least sixteen units of high school study, including eleven units in English, mathematics, history, natural science, social science, and foreign language. At St. Andrews, your high school grade point average, class rank, and ACT or SAT test scores, as well as your potential college success will be evaluated. Applications from students who have attended non-traditional high schools are also welcome. Prospective students will receive immediate notification of the admission decision once the application process is complete.

### Required materials for Freshmen Applicants:

- Application for Admission with \$25 application fee
- Official high school transcript(s)
- 3. Official SAT or ACT score(s)

### Required materials for Transfer Applicants:

- Application for Admission with \$25 application fee
- Official college academic transcript(s) from all post-secondary schools attended
- Official high school transcript(s), unless the student has an Associates or higher degree
- Official college financial aid transcript(s) (FAT) from all post-



secondary school(s) attended, regardless of whether or not the student received financial aid, unless you are not planning to apply for financial aid

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### About four out of five students at St. Andrews receive some form of financial assistance.

Our financial aid program combines merit-based and traditional need-based assistance. In an effort to make St. Andrews an affordable value, nearly 80% of our students receive some type of financial assistance.

All students are advised to apply for financial aid. Comparisons between families cannot be made because each family has a different financial situation. The College administers traditional federal and state programs, including the Federal Pell Grant, FFEL



Stafford Loan (for students), Federal Perkins Loan, FFEL PLUS Loan (for parents), and North Carolina Legislative Tuition Grant. Monthly payment plans and campus employment are available. Merit scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic, athletic, and artistic achievement and potential, and we offer institutional grants to those with demonstrated need. ### **Financial Aid Process**

Submit the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and list the St. Andrews financial aid code (002967) so the college will receive the results.

### Merit Scholarships

St. Andrews has implemented a new merit based scholarship and grant program. All full-time students who apply for admission are evaluated for eligibility to receive the St. Andrews Merit Scholarship or the St. Andrews Merit Grant. The amount of the merit award is based on your academic credentials. Awards are renewable for four years of full-time enrollment. Please contact the Admissions Office to determine your eligibility.
